
British Birds of Prey GOSHAWK

The goshawk is a diurnal raptor (active during the day) with broad wings and a long, rounded tail. There are several species of goshawk, with the northern goshawk being native to the UK and by far the most widespread.

They belong to the Acciptier genus, known as the 'true hawks'. Their scientific name gentilis means 'noble': in the Middle Ages, only the very highest social classes were permitted to use goshawks for falconry.



Goshawk

In the UK, the goshawk population all but disappeared towards the end of the 19th century, due to habitat loss and being hunted to protect game birds. Numbers have since risen, with about 400 pairs estimated in the UK, though may well be more due to the goshawk's secretive nature. They are distributed most commonly throughout Wales, northern England and into Scotland.

Juvenile goshawks have a brown colouration with vertical 'stripes' down their underparts, whilst the adults look very different, with slate-grey wings and horizontally barred underparts. Their eyes also turn from a pale yellow to a dark orange colour, usually after their second year.

Northern goshawks have a reputation for being feisty and fearless. Highly territorial, they will defend their nesting site fiercely. The females attract a mate through vocalisations and by performing aerobatic displays, with a bonded pair typically remaining together for their whole lives. Their nests are built very close to the tree trunk, and measure a metre wide!

Goshawk

Goshawks, like most birds of prey, are opportunistic hunters, meaning they'll attempt to catch and eat almost anything smaller than them if they have the chance. Their preferred hunting grounds are woodlands and the forest edge, where they will make short but fast flights in pursuit of prey, reaching nearly 40mph. It is believed that, whilst pursuing birds, goshawks can position themselves in flight so that the prey cannot see them past its own tail!
